Ask your SHIP funding guru-- I think Angie Sellers is familiar with the SHIP allocation excel spreadsheet-- to run SHIP funding based upon the following SAIL-like facts

1. There is \$56,925,000 in the "first dime"
2. There is \$18,075,000 in the second dime.
3. Solve for allocation to Dade County

It won't be exactly what I put in my example in the first email, but it will be in that range (it will be somewhat lower because Dade's percentage of the population is a bit less than its percentage of need, and the SHIP allocation spreadsheet solves for \$350,000 minimums that slightly reduce large county funding)

I think this will confirm my basic premise on the precedent that has already been set for 15 years as to how FHFC interprets the statute relating to Dade funding.
