• What are the essential issues affecting the provision of affordable housing in Florida today and what will they be in the coming years?

The disabled person(s) face many hardships in housing purchases. First the actual purchase can often be taken as somewhat of a joke by many in the purchase process. The disabled are not joking when they tell the realtor, loan officer or other important persons in the purchase process that they are serious buyers. • What should Florida Housing and our many partners do to address these issues?
