

Florida Housing to Hold a Telephonic Emergency Public Meeting on June 9, 2009

Florida Housing and the Florida Department of Community Affairs are holding a telephonic emergency public meeting on June 9, 2009 regarding its intent to apply for Neighborhood Stabilization Program 2 (NSP2) funding being issued, through a competitive process, by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). Florida Housing, in partnership with the Florida Department of Community Affairs, is interested in applying for the funding to assist local governments, community development organizations, housing providers and other stakeholders address the stabilization and revitalization of neighborhoods and communities, across Florida, that HUD has targeted as being significantly affected and at risk due to factors related to the national and state's economic downturn and foreclosure crisis.

The purpose of this meeting is to solicit comments from the general public, local governments, community stakeholders, agencies, housing developers and other interested parties that will assist Florida Housing and the Department of Community Affairs in determining the objectives, strategies and approaches that will best utilize the resources being made available through this Federal funding opportunity.
