Disability Rights Florida submits this public comment to support the state's work to create a State Supportive Housing Action Plan. Disability Rights Florida (DRF) is a not-for-profit corporation which acts as the state's federally-mandated Protection and Advocacy (P&A) System for individuals with disabilities. As Florida's P&A System, DRF's mission is to advocate, educate, investigate, and litigate to protect and advance the rights, dignity, equal opportunities, self-determination, and choices for all people with disabilities.

Supportive housing is a critical housing option for people with a variety of disabilities who require supports to live lives of dignity as fully integrated members of our communities. Stable housing with supports is the foundation for improved health, employment, and education outcomes and has been shown to reduce the likelihood of costly interventions including emergency room visits and incarceration.¹ The State's commitment to the funding and development of affordable and integrated supportive housing and to the creation and implementation of best management practices is essential to the expansion and efficacy of supportive housing in Florida. DRF urges the state to take bold steps to enable the collection and sharing of agency data about housing and service needs and availability, require effective communication between state agencies, promote and facilitate the braiding of various housing funds, and to increase the funding to train and retain the service workers who provide necessary housing supports. DRF strongly supports the creation of a Supportive Housing Trust Fund. A dedicated Supportive Housing Trust Fund is critical to the long-term success of supportive housing communities and their residents. DRF urges the state to take this opportunity to create a State Supportive Housing Action Plan that help fulfill Florida's obligation to ensure the complete integration of people with disabilities into our communities by improving access to stable, affordable, supportive housing.
