Sorry for the delay providing these comments. I thank you for the ongoing opportunity for stakeholders and community members to participate in the development of draft RFAs. In reviewing the 11-7-14 draft, I would like to provide the following.

- Case Managers we recommend including persons with an AA and at least two years related experience as eligible to provide the service.
- Supportive Housing Experience I neglected to mention in my prior comments, that in addition
  to property management experience in operating permanent supportive housing, it is important
  for the applicant to demonstrate asset management experience in the operation of permanent
  supportive housing. For the reasons outlined in comments for prior RFAs, it is best for the entity
  responsible for oversight of property management to demonstrate experience in the operation
  of site-based permanent supportive housing. Ultimately, it is the asset management
  requirements that dictate the property management policies.
- Points for 100% Nonprofit I also neglected to mention in my previous comments that, for homeless projects, points should be provided for applicants that are 100% nonprofit. For the reasons outlined in comments for prior RFAs and the UAC, homeless projects in which a missionbased nonprofit is solely responsible for development of asset management requirements, etc. are better suited to serving the needs of homeless households.
