I have been a long-time resident of Gainesville/Alachua County (since 1989), serving the community in both the private sector with commercial development and as a business owner as well as the public sector having been elected a City Commissioner. More recently, I was invited to participate as a board member for our local housing agency and just learned that our community might have the opportunity to apply for special federal Community Development-Disaster Relief funds not allocated to those counties that were more directly impacted. Being able to apply for a large-scale new affordable housing project would be very significant for a medium-sized county such as ours with a flagship university and service industry distinct from many others with similar population and demographics. As I work in the commercial real estate business on a daily basis, I can tell you that acquisitions are very hard to come by for nonprofit housing providers such as our agency's instrumentality. The need to help those who fall between the 30-80% AMI on our waiting list is great indeed and while preserving the existing stock in the market where serious rehabilitation is necessary, aide towards new construction is a must thanks to extraordinary high cost of new construction being a major impediment on potential projects where vacant land is available. Our situation is unique as Gainesville/Alachua County is both a university town and place of convergence for veterans from surrounding rural areas due to our VA hospital system. As a former public servant and current agency commissioner, I implore you to keep Alachua County in mind for any additional programming that may be set aside for medium or smaller size counties.
